

26TH FIAP PROJECTED IMAGES BIENNIAL

The PAGB, with a thematic panel of Creative Still Life photographs illustrated below, were awarded a Silver Medal for Third Place in the FIAP PDI Biennial. Italy were First with 262 Points, host nation Belgium were Second with 261 Points whilst the Great Britain achieved 260 Points. Although the PAGB represents "Great Britain" both the SPF and the WPF are separately affiliated to FIAP and they tied in a 4 country 10th= on 243 Points for which they were awarded an Hon. Mention. 



I enter Federation competitions each year, plus some National ones when time allows.


For my job I worked with aerial photography at Hunting Surveys and then at Aerofilms, mainly involving the use of large format





SECURITY OF YOUR E-MAIL ADDRESS

There have been two "commercial" communications sent recently to a large number of you – in one case with the addresses accidently not listed BCC. Four or Five readers have contacted me asking if **e-news** supplied the addresses. I would like to assure readers that we did not. **e-news** holds your e-mail addresses confidentially and securely and **will never divulge your address to a third party**. I followed up both cases that I know about and the authors assured me that the e-mail contacts were culled from Club Websites and other places where they were "publicly" listed.

This is Issue 50 of e-news which started in a very small way in 2008 and is cascaded now to over 10,000 readers, not to mention the many websites that display it. In the 8 months since we moved to Campaign Monitor for distribution 853 new readers have subscribed - an average of 106 per month. (Of course, every issue, a few unsubscribe - but then again, too few to mention).




