
The Plate Competition was equally hard fought with Chorley P.S. (L&CPU) and Catchlight C.C. (NIPA) sharing the trophy.

Peterborough Photographic Society

PETERBOROUGH P.S. QUASQUICENTENNIAL

With 65 members, Peterborough Photographic Society (PPS), it is a far cry today from its modest start in a small coffee shop in 1887.

To celebrate its 125th year, PPS held a special exhibition at Peterborough Museum. It consisted of 32 specially selected prints, eight of which dated back to the 1930's, reflecting the style of Monochrome photography that was in vogue during that period. The remainder were from the current membership - 1980's to the present day.

Amongst the 100 or so invited guests and the current President, Richard Houghton, were a further 11 Past Presidents of the Society, many still active as members. PPS has organised other events throughout the year to mark its quasquicentennial.

The first meeting of the Society was held on Friday 20 May 1887 at the Bedford Coffee Tavern-with 18 gentlemen present. In the chair was Dr G Kirkwood, who was elected President, an office which he held until his death in 1916. Meetings were then held monthly, and the annual subscription was 2/6. There were 30 members at the end of the first year. Some of the early members were prominent businessmen in the City and included a number of clergymen. The first lady member joined in 1901.

The society has met continuously since then, apart from a short period the first world war, and has meticulously maintained archives including the original minute book from 1887. The first public exhibition was held at the 'Bedford' in January 1899. There were 350 prints and 174 lantern slides. During the Second World War, meetings continued without a break, although films and printing paper were almost unobtainable. At the end of the war, member's subscriptions were increased to 10/-(50p). This was the first increase in subscriptions since 1887.

In 1947, a Dinner was held at the Campbell Hotel to celebrate the Society's Diamond Jubilee. The guest of honour was Mr Percy Harris, FRPS, Vice President of the Royal Photographic Society, and Editor of the Miniature Camera Magazine. In 1950 the membership exceeded 100 for the first time. In 1953, Coronation Year, the Annual Exhibition was held in the Maxwell Art Gallery. Mr W D Varney was elected President of the East Anglian Federation for 1954 / 1955. In 1984, the Society reached the finals of the PAGB/Minolta Slide Championship, and won the Bronze Medal.

In 1985, the Society was affiliated to the North & East Midlands Photographic Federation, whilst retaining affiliation with the East Anglian Federation. The Society again reached the finals of the PAGB/Minolta Slide Championship at Solihull and, this time, won the Silver Medal.

For the Society's Centenary in 1987, a number of special events were held, culminating with a Grand Dinner where the guest of Honour was Heather Angel, MSc, FRPS, FBIPP, FLS.

With the advent of Digital Photography – the Society has changed from those former years - but like its forebears continues to work closely with the local community, contributing to projects such as the" *Changing Face of Peterborough* " at the City Museum, and providing photographs for the newly built hospital. More recently, in a collaborative venture with the Peterborough Civic Society, PPS has been working on a book, "*Peterborough and its Villages in Detail*" Launched in November 2012 and celebrates the architectural detail of distinctive buildings in Peterborough and its surrounding villages. The book contains a foreword by Civic Vice president, Griff Rhys Jones.

We are proud to have reached such a milestone in our history as the Society has kept abreast and embraced of all the latest developments in the art of photography - and look forward to its continuity and celebrating our Sesquicentennial in 2037!!



<u>Birmingham Central Library</u> is an exciting building and holds one of the **<u>National Collections of Photography.</u>**




This includes prints, negatives, lantern slides, books illustrated with original photographic prints and photomechanical reproductions, photographic books and periodicals. The collections are not housed as single


