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DISTINCTION PROGRAMME IN CHAOS

On 28 November I attended the FIAP Annual General Meeting in Vienna. I find it almost beyond belief to have to report that the FIAP Directory Board, at its meeting the day before the AGM, resolved to make substantial changes to the Criteria for FIAP Distinctions to take effect as from 1st January 2016.

To say that FIAP have managed to make an art form of incompetence is not an exaggeration. They have totally failed to display any coherent decision making process over this issue. As a result of petitions from certain countries, they have performed a complete "volte-face" and produced a third version, insisting that it will come into effect in less than 5 weeks. Even worse than that, they are not yet able to supply precise details of the changes, only a summary.

The changes range from AFIAP through to EFIAP Platinum, and whilst we do not at this time know the precise details or the full extent of the changes and figures involved, the new rules will include -

- a) Complete removal of 15% rule in respect of maximum acceptances from a single country
- b) Replacement at AFIAP and EFIAP of the 10% rule regarding print acceptances with a requirement for a specific number of Titles to have received at least one Print acceptance.
- c) Re-instating the barrier between EFIAP and EFIAP Bronze, so that Acceptances/Awards at AFIAP and EFIAP will no longer be available to count towards EFIAP levels applications.
- d) To counter c) above reductions in the numbers required for EFIAP Levels Distinctions.
- e) Requirements at Levels for acceptances to be gained from a specified number of countries. I am told the new rules will make the getting EFIAP Levels Distinctions much easier.

For many, most of these changes will be welcome and may even enable some to make applications under the new rules that they could not have done before. For some others there may be drawbacks. I cannot be sure until I see the fine detail. This may not be available for a few weeks as it has to be drafted and translated into four languages. You will be advised as soon as is practicable.

However, as a result of my strong representations and, because our application process was already under way, we may well have got to a situation where one could apply the adage -

"Every Cloud has a Silver Lining" - perhaps even a Gold or Platinum one for some.

I have secured an undertaking that effectively means prospective applicants through PAGB will be able to gain their awards in 2016 via either set of rules. What this means is:-

- 1. For those who have already registered with me for an award **NOTHING CHANGES**. Please do not seek to make changes, you will only be wasting both your time and mine.
- 2. For those who have not yet registered because they have not yet met the current criteria, but are still working towards them, **CONTINUE TO DO SO**. If you get there before 31 Jan 2016, you can still register and apply using the criteria in place since May of this year.
- 3. For those who have find or have found it impossible to meet the criteria published in May, **PLEASE BE PATIENT**. Once I have the full details I will publish them in e-news and on our website. If you find that you can meet the latest criteria, and provided you can do so by 31 Jan 2016, I can process your application under the NEW version of the rules.

One final point; any application will have to be FULLY under one of the sets of rules or the other as there can be no "mixing and matching".
