This year we would like to invite you to take part in this selection process for the FIAP Colour Biennial by submitting up to 12 colour images across the following three categories; a. Creative Portraits

- b. Minimalism
- c. Humour

The FIAP Biennial Competition is both a Print and PDI Competition, so we would be asking for high resolution versions of your images, if selected for the print entry.

30 Images will be selected in total and all images scoring more than 8 points in the actual FIAP Biennial can be used a part of a FIAP Distinction Application.

Out of the thirty Images we will select and Print 10 for our Print Entry and 20 for our Digital Entry.

Images should be saved as .jpg in srgb format and 2400 pixels on their longest side, before uploading to the Competition Entry System.


All submitted images will be scored and the higher scoring images along with the selected images will be included on a Digital Slideshow available from the PAGB Recorded Lecture Service.



In particular, his photographs of the Milk Market and Limerick in the 70's have received worldwide acclaim. In 2012 the Hunt Museum, Limerick displayed those images as their premier summer exhibition and the show, which ran for four months, attracted record numbers to the museum and was extended by popular demand. Following that exhibition he self published a book of the Milk Market photographs. That publication 'Shaped by History' received Book of the Year award at the 2012 Irish Print Awards. Following the success of his book and exhibition, he was invited to display that body of work at the National Photographic Archive Gallery, Dublin in 2015. The Shaped by History exhibition was sponsored by the Hunt Museum, the Department of Arts and Heritage and the Limerick City of Culture. It was Gerry's fifth one man photographic exhibition and attracted a total of over seventy-five thousand visitors to both the National Archive Photographic Gallery and the Hunt Museum. A selection of the Milk Market photographs are included in the permanent collection of the University of Limerick and displayed on campus at the Kemmy Business School.

THE CLUB THAT COMES TO YOU

United Photographic Postfolios (UPP) have just created three new Circles that operate using Zoom. This is a brand new venture which widens the scope of UPP

U.P.P. "The Camera Club that comes to you", is one of the very few clubs that has been able to continue normally during the CV pandemic. Members of print Circles have still received the prints in the post and online Circles have been completely unaffected. However, many clubs are now successfully organising their meetings through platforms such as Zoom.

U.P.P is also embracing this technology and has established three new Circles. More will be set up according to demand. The Zoom Circles 'meet' monthly, and operate as a forum to talk about images, ideas and experiences. This enables pictures to be discussed in much greater depth than, for example, on a competition night, when the judge's appraisals are necessarily much more limited and there is no opportunity to respond to the points raised. And of course, images that can be 'improved' as a result of the discussions can then be entered in a normal Club competition.

A Zoom Circle is an excellent addition to membership of a normal club. Taking part and sharing images in this way helps develop and generally improve one's photographic skills. 

The PAGB Awards for Photographic Merit (APM) Online Advisory Service is a way by which those who have applied for an Award for Photographic Merit can get advice on their submission, or those who are considering applying for an award can get advice on whether or not they meet the standard.

The service is offered by a number of experienced volunteer advisors who have generously agreed to offer their time. Each advisee will be allocated to an individual advisor.

You must be qualified to apply for an award at the level for which you are requesting advice.

In summary -

- you must be a current active member of a PAGB Affiliated Club
- the minimum duration of membership is 2 years for CPAGB, 3 years for DPAGB and 5 years for MPAGB.

The information entered on the form sends an email to the Advisory Service organiser and is not retained on the website.

The service is limited by the number of available advisors. Applicants cannot be guaranteed a place for advice and may be placed on a waiting list.



AWARDS FOR PHOTOGRAPHIC MERIT

2020 ADJUDICATIONS

After much hard work by the organisers and following an extensive trial, there will soon be an online Adjudication of the outstanding 2020 CPAGB and DPAGB PDI Applications, with the results being announced before the end of that month. We do not consider this to be an ideal solution, as judging images on remote monitors is simply not the same as viewing them projected onto an 8' screen, but we now feel that there is no other choice.

Very few events are judged against a set standard and we have done everything we can to ensure maintenance of that standard and fairness in the scoring, with a review process similar to that undertaken at a normal Adjudication.

We have looked at different methods of conducting a Print Adjudication and have concluded that, with the numbers involved, there is no satisfactory way to do this remotely. We remain committed to holding a Print Adjudication at the earliest possible opportunity. At the very worst the 2020 Print entries will be added to the Adjudication planned for May 2021.

ADJUDICATION FOR PRINT AND PDI - 15 MAY 2021

The situation is still unclear, and, despite the good news of vaccines, this Adjudication is in the balance. Already, we do not believe that there is any prospect of it being open to an audience. We are still hoping that a Closed Adjudication can go ahead. If not, surely June or July will be possible,

DPAGB and MPAGB are now fully subscribed for this Adjudication but there are still openings at CPAGB in Print or PDI. Please be aware that, because of the large Print numbers if we have to include the 2020 backlog, we may opt for an Online Adjudication for CPAGB and DPAGB PDI in May. This may allow us to accept additional entries.

MPAGB are so important that we intend to retain these entries until a live Adjudication is possible, with an audience. We will, of course, keep this under review. Rod Wheelans

The intention was to interpret the range of emotions that so many of us have experienced during this horrendous period in our lives and how we are feeling now.








The first set is about the "First Lockdown", showing bemusement, how scared people were and a cry for the help that so many people needed.




The images were all shot using a Fuji XT2 and most with the 18-55mm lens.

Competitions feature prominently in most camera clubs. Entering these competitions implicitly assumes that all parts of the image are the work of the entrant and this grey area is policed by our appointed judges. It is foolish indeed to enter someone else's image in your own name or as an important element of your image, as a few photographers have found to their cost.

Some are readily available free of charge and some you have to pay for.


I produce images that give me a great deal of pleasure. I use my own images as a the basis for these "art" images and, since the

RECORDED LECTURE SERVICE

In order to access the Recorded Lecture Service the Club must register in the PAGB Competition Entry System, so as to be verified as an Affiliated Club.

The PAGB Recorded Lecture Service (RLS) acquires a library of talks which may be borrowed by Affiliated Member Clubs. The Service Secretary is always interested to commission additional material for the Service. The RLS will normally hold PAGB originated material including Inter-Federation Exhibitions, GB Cups events, compilations from the PAGB Awards scheme, and others as available. Plus commissioned lectures by individuals or groups. And content donated by commercial sponsors and others.

Terms of Business

- · Only PAGB Affiliated Clubs have access to the RLS.
- Clubs may use their access to obtain a licence for one or more items in the RLS catalogue. Some items in the RLS will incur a licence charge, but some will be free.
- Each licence is for viewing by the Club as an organisation and is not transferable to members within the Club or to anyone outside the Club.**
- A licence may be used for repeat showing within the Club, without time limit.

Procedure:

A PAGB Affiliated Club accesses the RLS via this link https://pagbhost.co.uk/main and using the Club's logon. The site has information about registration and password recovery. Each Club has a profile with an email address and postal address. The RLS will only use these contact addresses, and the Club is responsible for their management. The current catalogue is then viewable. For each catalogue item where the Club already has a licence, the item can be downloaded again for no further charge. Where an item has no charge, then a licence can be obtained, and the item downloaded. Where an item has a charge, then this can be paid on-line to obtain a licence and the item downloaded.

- · After requesting a download, a message is sent to the email address of the Club containing a time-limited link to the item.
- Downloads can be large. For an additional 'p&p' charge, the Club can request the item on hard media (usually a data stick) and this will be sent to the postal address of the Club. As this is a manual process, Clubs should allow 4 weeks for delivery.

Print Collections

The PAGB also has some print collections, either boxed or in albums and these may be requested via the RLS. As these are single copy sets, availability is limited, and timing will need to be discussed. The Club will be responsible for two-way transport and any booking fee. **Some camera clubs and societies have made the decision to cancel their club meetings in an attempt to reduce the risk of infection of the Coronavirus (COVID-19). To support clubs and societies during this difficult time we have decided to relax the terms of business for the PAGB RLS and allow the distribution of recorded lectures to members within their respective club or society.

Clubs and societies are asked to adhere to the following:

- 1. Clubs and societies may only distribute a PAGB lecture to their members providing they own a license for that lecture
- 2. Clubs and societies may only distribute a PAGB lecture to their members up until 31 May 2021
- 3. Clubs and societies are asked to ensure that all copies (including any links) are destroyed or removed on or before 31 May 2021
- 4. A club official must send an email to the PAGB RLS secretary informing them of the club or societies intention to distribute a lecture prior to doing so giving details of said lecture
