



ADRIAN LINES MPAGB FBPE EFIAP Chorley PS, Lancashire & Cheshire Photographic Union.



I coordinate and arrange the various PAGB Executive meetings, receive and send correspondence from and to our happy members and liaise with other organisations who wish to contact the PAGB. I am also responsible for recording and distributing the minutes of the Executive meetings and AGM.

I am always looking for new and innovative ways to improve the services of the PAGB and I am

happy to take sensible suggestions and feedback.

I am also the 'un-paid' web developer of the PAGB Competition and APM entry system, so I also try and introduce improvements in our online services, and have developed such 'online' things as booking recorded lectures, event ticketing, the "Find a club" national map, catalogue ordering, VR Exhibitions and digital forms, along with adapting the online entry system to carry out online judging, allowing competitions such as the GB Cup & Trophy, 'Inter-Federation' and 'PDI Championship' to proceed during the covid restrictions.

I am hoping to develop future projects, and these may include introducing better communication systems, on-line directories and the adoption of Quality Management systems.



Chichester Camera Club's Annual Exhibition goes viral this year with a record-breaking 60 participating photographers.

The exhibition comes in three parts, each with some 200 images covering every area from street to portraiture, landscape to creative, nature to still life with travel and documentary as well. Images include the exhibition judge's choices in various genres and examples of work from the season's competition winners.

29th FIAP Colour Biennial - FRANCE 2021 https://www.fiap.net/en/biennials

Biennials are one of the most important events offered by FIAP. They are organized every two years in a different member country. Even years for Black and White and Nature Biennials, odd years for the Colour Biennial.

The participation is free. Biennials have a very particular characteristic, different from the international contests. It is not only the quality of the individual work that counts, but FIAP ask for coherent collections, as well of the viewpoint of inspiration and conception as form the viewpoint of execution and presentation. The judgement of the collections is made in two steps:

- 1) the judgement of each work of the collection
- 2) the global judgement of the collection.

The collection obtaining the highest score by the addition of the points of the first and the second judgment, wins the World Cup of the corresponding Biennial. Individual prizes are also awarded to the best works regardless of the classification by federations.


